Whereas: In the anticipation of that effective union, many of the administrative functions and staffing are working to align offices and provide services to both conferences in 2021.

Whereas: The current pandemic has led the Conference leadership to reimagine office and staffing needs.

Therefore, be it resolved, that should the studies related to the merger indicate the need to sell the Tennessee Conference Headquarters, the Conference Trustees are authorized to sell the building and if necessary to purchase or remodel other properties.

Therefore, be it resolved, that the Memphis Conference Board of Trustees and the Council of Finance and Administration in consultation with the Bishop and Cabinet conduct a study of office space needs both now and in the future taking into consideration the current Conference Office and the recently acquired People of Hope church.

Be it further resolved, that if either of the buildings does not meet the office space needs or requirements as determined by the study, that the Board of Trustees be authorized to sell one or both buildings and the proceeds be designated for the acquisition and furnishing of future office space in the Memphis or Tennessee-Western Kentucky Conference.
